Attitude Indicator intermittent, will be sent back for repairs, light on VSI still out, starter bendix sticky when hot, won't engage will get new starter.

N983SP David reported nose shimmy may be minimized with pilot technique. Beacon light socket is broken and on order Bob will replace it when it comes in. Gasket on cowling is loose.

AD on fuel injector plate must be inspected every 50 hour or oil change, whichever comes first, critical to change oil and perform inspection before 50 hrs!!!

Plane is considered not airworthy otherwise

N415RC Bryan reported nose strut rebuilt. Left mag greater drop on test, improves with leaning, be sure to lean left mag all the way. EGT out.
