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Attendance & Minutes

The Business Men's Flying Club held its monthly meeting on Tuesday, May 1st, 2012 at Naper Aero. The meeting began at 7:44 pm.

The meeting minutes were accepted as published with no issues found.

The treasurer presented the summary of payments made for maintenance items such as 5RC strut service, tach installation, and fixing of an oil leak. He then stated the maintenance reserves were fully funded and mentioned the principal and interest payments to the bank. The total overhaul expense for 5RC was stated as being about 36000.00 not including the crankshaft purchased two years ago. The camshaft was "free". A member questioned the monthly datalink charge for 5RC. The next engine to be overhauled is about 2 years from now. This will req. about 1500.00 per month to fund. A discussion ensued about when to overhaul the engine and going past TBO. The treasurers report was accepted as published.

- Audio panel squeal is confirmed by two other people (over the age of 50).
- 3. Auto pilot does not beep on disconnect in NAV mode.
- 4. The oil was changed.
- 5. Pitot static check was accomplished.
- 6. Nose tire will be changed.
- 7. W/B info has been located.
- 8. Landing light changed.

<u>N983SP</u>

- 1. No complaints about the plane lately.
- 2. Tire pressure was low and has been corrected. Pilots are reminded to check and correct the pressures if necessary.

N415RC

- 1. Engine break in is officially over. Reports are that it runs like a top!
- 2. DG and turn coordinator lights have been fixed.
- Wheel pants still off. They are now painted but are missing hardware. Update – hardware found recently.
- 4. Audio panel squelch knob still missing.
- 5. Kris says the seat hydro lock is broken. Eric has a lead on a cheaper alternative.
- 6. The radio has some noise that cannot be accounted for.
- 7. Tannis heater pad will need replacing now.
- 8. The fire extingusher has been replaced.

Reminders

- Windshield washing: Please use a CLEAN soft CLOTH. Paper scratches the windshield.
- Don't park at the pumps for extended periods.
- Red BFC compressor available to fill tires.
- Apply brakes momentarily on climb out to save on tire wear.
- Log oil added in the airplane logbook.
- Tap the brakes on climb out to save the tires.
- Watch your HEAD when moving around under those wings!
- Wash off the bugs after your flight so they don't have a chance to weld themselves to the paint. Your saving 10min of work means 30 for the next member.
